

We use online forms all the time. As the world becomes more digitized, more and more forms are completed online or downloaded from the Internet as a fillable PDF.

Online forms are completed by entering the information requested directly on your computer screen. Government forms are often filled out online or downloaded from the Internet as a fillable PFD document.

Here is a list of the 10 most common downloaded fillable PDF Government of Bridge forms:



In addition to the government many other places use online forms every day. Employers often use online job application forms. Sports clubs and children's camps use online registration forms. Shopping online requires filling in an online form.



There are different methods that online or fillable PDF forms typically use for you to enter the information.

Method of Entry	How it Works
Fields or Boxes	You type the information requested into the field or box on the
	screen. You will usually be limited in how much you can type.

You click on the box or the arrow in the box and it gives you options in a list to choose from. You choose the correct option by clicking on it and populating the field.
You click on the checkbox that corresponds to your answer. There may be more than one option that can be checked off. It may be a single box you have to check to indicate that you understand something you have read.
You select the small circle that corresponds to your answer.
There are four typical ways a date is added to a form. Date fields allow you to type in a date.



Tips for Filling in a Form

- Before you start, read the form over. Make sure you have all the information you need to complete the form.
- To fill in a field on a form, place your cursor over the field you want to fill in and left click. You should be able to type your information into the form.
- To move from field to field you can use the TAB button. If this doesn't work, move your cursor to the next field.

- To fill in a check box or radio box, place your cursor over the box you want to select. When the cursor changes shape, left click the mouse button and a check or dot should appear in the box. To deselect, left click on the check box or radio box again.
- Some fields will limit the amount of information you can enter.
