The Internet and devices that connect to the Internet can be very useful and can also be fun to use. Many tools and sites you use on the Internet require you to "sign up" or register. It's important that you understand the information you are giving and how it can be used. Here is an example of a "sign up" pop-up you might see on an Internet site.

Personal and Private Information Online

Personal Information is information that usually can't be used to identify you on its own. Your personal information tells people things like who you are, where you are, and what you like. Some examples:

- Age
- Gender
- Favourite things

This information is usually safe to share online. However, it can be used in combination with private information to help someone identify you.

Private information is information that can be used to identify you. Some examples:

Social Insurance number (SIN)

- Address
- Phone number
- Email address
- Credit card information

Identity Theft

Identity theft or identity fraud is a crime where someone uses your information to pretend to be you or to steal things from you. Once an identity thief has enough information about you, they can use it to do things like buy things on your credit card, post things on your social media account(s) or apply for identification with your name on it like a driver's license.
